



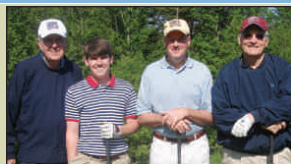

The theme for this year is experience dentistry's complete evolution from pain to esthetically driven, with a glimpse of the past, the realities of today, and a clear vision for the future.

technology, maintaining the public trust, the basis of our success, and helping create a patient-centered, biologically-based, biomimetic dentistry.

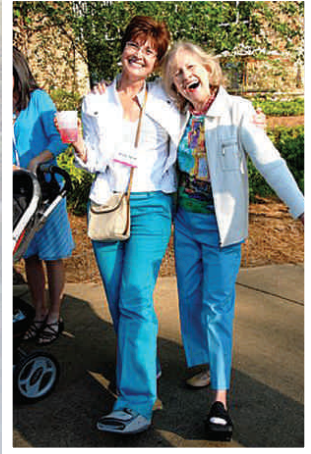
A "Hinman Digital Desktop" will be created on the exhibit floor to offer information and a glimpse of emerging and improving technologies in a centralized area.

Avid Adventure Traveler and Furniture Craftsman, Dr. Eddie Pafford Tackles Presidency with Same Passion

Mountain-climber, furniture craftsman, athletic coach, and of course, dentist. These are just a few of the titles Dr. Eddie Pafford can claim since graduating from dental school in 1976. With a broad spectrum of hobbies and interests, Dr. Pafford has spent little time standing still.

In fact, he's not only this year's president of the Hinman Dental Society, he's also the educational program co-chairman with Dr. Isler. Multi-tasking appears to be Dr. Pafford's forte' – as does balancing career, family and life interests.
