Hinman 2010 Draws 21,795 and Unveils New Look and Logo

The 98th Thomas P. Hinman Dental Meeting attracted one of its largest crowds this year – drawing exactly 21,795 dentists, hygienists, dental assistants, students and other dental professionals and industry personnel to the Georgia World Congress Center in Atlanta. The meeting experienced nearly a 2 percent increase in attendance. With the theme, “All Roads Lead to Excellence at Hinman,” the 2010 meeting featured more than 60 leading dental experts, 200+ courses and workshops, and at least 400 industry leading companies.

“We are very excited about the increase in attendance this year. We saw more dentists, hygienists, assistants and students in attendance and believe this is due to a very strong educational program, one of the best technical exhibits in the industry and some outstanding networking and social events,” said Dr. Max Ferguson, Hinman’s 2010 General Chairman.

In addition this year, Hinman unveiled a new look and logo that will be rolled out over the next two years, leading up to Hinman’s 100th meeting in 2012. During the Keynote Session on Thursday night, Dr. Ferguson shared the news with the audience, revealing the new look and logo. He also reported that as they sat in the auditorium, signs and banners were

being replaced and by the following morning, much of the signage would feature Hinman’s new image.

Following the unveiling, he said, “I want you to remember one very important thing.

Although the skin may look a little tighter, the wrinkles less noticeable and the hair a little darker, it’s just a facelift and underneath all of this is still the attention to detail and quality and the unparalleled southern hospitality that will continue to make Hinman the best dental meeting in the world!”

Another exciting addition to the meeting this year was the new all-day educational tracks for dental hygienists, assistants and office staff. More than 980 dental hygienists attended the Prevention Convention courses. Approximately 580 dental assistants attended the Assisting Extravaganza sessions and more than 830 office staff participated in the Business Office Bonanza seminars.

With Hinman 2010 ending on a high note, preparations have begun for “another best Hinman ever.” Hinman 2011 will be held March 24-26, 2011. The theme for next year’s meeting is “Quality Continuing Education Served with Southern Hospitality.” 🌸

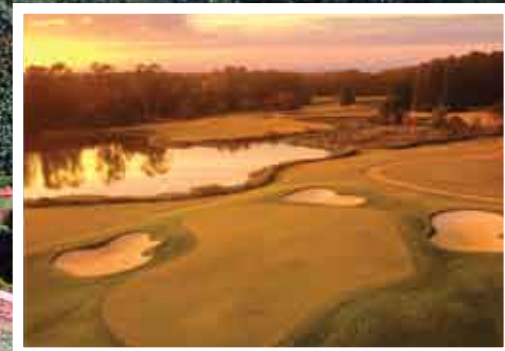
