

Passionate Scuba Diver & Former Naval Officer, Dr. William Rousseau, Named Hinman Dental Society President

Of course, endodontics is Dr. William Rousseau's professional passion. But, when he's not at his practice, he and his wife, Beth, love to travel and scuba dive together. In fact, they just returned from a week-long diving trip to Belize. He's been certified since middle school and has been diving throughout the Caribbean, French Polynesia, Central America and Hawaii. His wife and two sons, Charlie [27] and Ben [26] are also certified scuba divers and he's been trying to talk his daughter, Ellie [21], into getting certified. "Scuba is a great way to relax and it's the perfect family trip," he added.

As graduates of UGA, he and Beth continue to be big UGA fans even though all three of their kids attended Ole Miss. They go to almost all of the Ole Miss home games, but they always have the Dawgs on their television in the Grove.

Born and raised in Atlanta, Dr. Rousseau is a second-generation dentist. His father is a life-long

After graduating from The Westminster Schools and the University of Georgia, he attended the Medical College of Georgia School of Dentistry. Prior to joining his father and brother in their general dentistry practice, he decided he wanted to see the world and was commissioned in the U.S. Navy. It was during his three years on active duty that he chose to pursue endodontics as a career. With

a lot of help from Dr. Bill Schroeder, he was accepted at the University of Louisville and moved his family to Kentucky to complete a residency in endodontics. He and Dr. Seth Stewart formed Northside Endodontics in 2004 and serve patients in the North Atlanta Metro area. He said, "The best part about being an endodontist is that you always exceed the patient's expectations, because no one is excited about getting a root canal."





In addition to the Hinman Dental Society, Dr. Rousseau is a member of the American Dental Association, the American Association of Endodontists, the Georgia Dental Association, the International College of Dentists, Georgia Association of Endodontists (past president) and the Southern Endodontic Study Group (past president). He is board certified by the American Board of Endodontics.

As President of the Hinman Dental Society, Dr. Rousseau's goal is to focus on the Hinman members and encourage them to return to in-person membership meetings and get reacquainted with fellow members. "We work in a very difficult profession and spend our time trying to fix other people's problems. Many times we do not take care of ourselves and there is nothing healthier than spending time with friends."

Dr. Rousseau says Hinman is special because of its members and their close involvement. After scouting other meetings as a program chair for the most recent meeting, he believes that the enthusiasm and hospitality of Hinman's volunteer members sets Hinman apart from all other meetings.

"My favorite part of being a Hinman member is the summer meeting. It is a very relaxing weekend among friends and family," he said. The annual meeting will be held at the Grand Hotel on Mobile Bay June 2-5, 2022.

Management of the Medically Complex Dental Patient

As general practitioners, we should be able to safely treat or manage medically complex patients and avoid complications. This program will focus on prevention and management of medically involved patients that we commonly see in our practices. Examples include everything from the anti-coagulated patient to the pregnant patient. We will review guidelines for treatment and discuss how to determine the right time to refer.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

- Participants will review the prevalence of disabilities in the U.S. population, and list examples of patients with special needs and disabilities who commonly present in dental practice.
- > Participants will review how to evaluate and assess risk related to dental patients with systemic disease.
- > Participants will review how to develop strategies for managing patients related to their systemic disease.
- > Participants will review how to evaluate common systemic disease and the practice modifications needed for predictable dental care.
- Participants will review clinical strategies and techniques that can enhance outcomes when caring for individuals with special needs or complex medical histories.

MICHAEL E. PRUETT, DMD

Dr. Pruett is an Assistant Professor in the department of Restorative Sciences and he is the Director of Continuing Education for the Dental College of Georgia. Prior to this, he served as Director of the General Practice Residency Program at The Dental College of Georgia for 21 years. He received his DMD from the Medical College of Georgia School of Dentistry, and then completed a two-year General Practice Residency at the University of Virginia. Upon completion, he became the Director of Dentistry at



Mount Sinai Hospital in Hartford, Connecticut. While in Hartford he also served as the Assistant Program Director of the General Practice Residency at Saint Francis Hospital and Medical Center.

Dr. Pruett has placed and restored dental implants for the last 29 years and maintains an active practice within the Dental College of Georgia. He is the co-director of the Augusta University/American Academy of Implant Dentistry Maxi-Course and several other hands-on continuing dental education courses at Augusta University. Dr. Pruett lectures nationally and internationally on a variety of topics.

He is a Fellow in the International College of Dentists, the Pierre Fauchard Academy, Associate Fellow in the American Academy of Implant Dentistry and a Diplomate in the International Congress of Oral Implantologists. He is also active in many dental organizations including ADA, Georgia Dental Association, Hinman Dental Society, American Society of Dental Anesthesiology, Academy of Osseointegration and the American Academy of Implant Dentistry. Dr. Pruett was the 2013 recipient of the Distinguished Alumnus Award for The Dental College of Georgia and was also the recipient of the Prestigious Hinman Medallion in 2018.
